Welcome! We are looking forward to working in partnership with you to achieve the best for your child. We hope that this information sheet will be helpful to you. The Class Teacher for Year 6 is Mr Hatton with Teaching Assistants Mrs Cole, Miss Resma and Mr Campbell. The purpose of this letter is to give you important information about what to expect in the new school year. The children should arrive at the pedestrian gate no later than 8.30am when they will then walk up to the classroom. P.E. Kit: All children come to school wearing their PE kit on a Tuesday and Friday. Kit should consist of the following: Beaumont T-shirt, shorts, trainers and a pair of plimsolls in their shoe bag. **The wearing of jewellery is not permitted, so children wearing ear studs should be able to remove them prior to their P.E. lesson.** All items of clothing (including lunchboxes) should be named. Children may bring in a piece of fruit for morning break. All children must bring in a named water bottle every day and a packet of tissues. We would be very grateful for any donations of boxes of tissues to use in class, please!

Tasks to support your child's learning:

Maths: we do practise tables at school, but they also need to be practised daily at home. We hope that you will find time to do this with your child. You can help by continuing to make sure he/she can read, write and recognise numbers up to 10,000,000. If that's too easy keep going up!

Reading: Your child should be taking their reading book home **every day** and bring it back into school the next morning. Home reading books can be changed when necessary. You can help your child by talking about the story and asking questions such as "Why do you think that happened?", "What do you think will happen next?" or "What would you do in this situation?" Please ensure that you regularly hear your child read and sign your child's reading record book.

Spellings: These will be set each week and tested. Lists will be matched to children's needs and will consist of some spellings from their personal spelling logs.

Home Learning Tasks: These tasks will be set every **Friday** and are due every **Tuesday**. We would recommend that the children use IXL Maths on a daily basis.

Year Six will start every morning from 8.30am. All the children are expected to attend. Year 6 is a very important year and we expect the children to be working very hard in school and complete all home learning which will prepare them for secondary school. **Unsatisfactory home learning will be completed during the day.** If you are anxious about any aspect of your child's work, please share your worries with us by appointment.
